

HJR 1 Berman

Calls for a constitutional amendment to allow the legislature to extend the property tax reduction enacted in 2005 to elderly and disabled people who had previously had their property taxes frozen at a higher level.

HJR 16 Leibowitz

Calls for a constitutional amendment to limit the maximum annual increase in appraised value of residential property to 5% (currently 10%).

HJR 18 Naishtat

Calls for a constitutional amendment to allow the legislature to extend the property tax reduction enacted in 2005 to elderly and disabled people who had previously had their property taxes frozen at a higher level.

HJR 21 Riddle

Calls for a constitutional amendment to authorize a local option cap on annual appraisal increases on residential property between 3% and 10%.

HJR 25 Raymond

Calls for a constitutional amendment prohibiting the authorization or funding of an elementary or secondary education voucher program.

HJR 26 Raymond

Calls for a constitutional amendment that directs the net gains from lottery money must be used to fund public education and that an equal amount of money shall be reduced from general revenue funds that would have gone to education. Further it prohibits lottery promoters from advertising or promoting lottery sales because it helps fund public schools.

HJR 27 Calligari

Calls for a constitutional amendment to limit the maximum annual increase in appraised value of residential property to 5% (currently 10%).

HJR 32 Bohac**Same as SJR 6**

Calls for a constitutional amendment to increase the maximum local option homestead exemption from 20% to 30% of appraised value for ad valorem taxation.

HJR 40 Hochberg

Calls for a constitutional amendment to limit appraisal increases for residential homesteads to 10% since the last appraisal.

HJR 42 Herrero

Calls for a constitutional amendment to increase the residential homestead exemption from \$15,000 to \$45,000.

HJR 44 Branch

Calls for a constitutional amendment to require any increase in the franchise tax to be approved by $\frac{3}{4}$ of all the members in each chamber.

HJR 45 Villarreal

Calls for a constitutional amendment to increase the maximum local option residential homestead exemption to \$15,000.

HJR 47 Bohac

Calls for a constitutional amendment to limit the increase in appraisal value on residence homesteads to 5% per year for school taxes.

HJR 48 Bohac

Calls for a constitutional amendment to authorize political subdivision to enact an exemption from ad valorem taxation of 10% - 25% of the appraised value for all residence homesteads.

HJR 51 Bohac

Calls for a constitutional amendment to increase the homestead exemption to \$25,000.

HJR 52 C. Howard

Calls for a constitutional amendment to authorize the legislature to limit the maximum annual appraisal increase to 3%.

HJR 55 Leibowitz

Calls for a constitutional amendment to increase the residence homestead exemption to \$45,000 and extend a similar tax reduction for senior citizens.

HJR 60 Chisum

Calls for a constitutional amendment to provide tax relief to senior citizens and providing that funds spent on property tax relief do not count toward the constitutional spending cap.

HJR 65 Hopson

Calls for a constitutional amendment to increase the homestead exemption to \$45,000.

HJR 66 Hopson

Calls for a constitutional amendment to increase the homestead exemption to \$22,500.

HJR 68 Olivo

Calls for a constitutional amendment to change the word school teacher to public school employee may receive compensation for serving on a local governing district.

HJR 86 Eiland

Calls for a constitutional amendment to increase the minimum local option homestead exemption from \$5000 to \$30,000.
