

SJR 6 Hinojosa

Calls for a constitutional amendment to increase the maximum local option homestead exemption from 20% to 30% of appraised value for ad valorem taxation.

SJR 10 Janek

Calls for a constitutional amendment to allow the governing body of a political subdivision to establish the maximum average annual percentage increase in appraised values of residential property of not less than 3%. Any change in that limit may not take effect until January 1 of the sixth year the limitation has been in place.

SJR 13 Averitt

Calls for a constitutional amendment to authorize the legislature to reduce property taxes for senior and disabled citizens to reflect the reduction in the rate of taxes and to provide that state appropriations made to reduce local taxes do not count against the constitutional spending limit.

SJR 14 Patrick

Calls for a constitutional amendment to limit the maximum annual appraisal increase on a residence homestead to 3%.

SJR 17 Hegar

Calls for a constitutional amendment to limit the maximum appraisal growth on residence homesteads to 10% since the last appraisal.

SJR 23 Nichols

Calls for a constitutional amendment to limit the annual appraisal increase for residence homesteads to 5% but allow county elections to increase that cap to not more than 10%.

SJR 24 Patrick**Same as HJR 1**

Calls for a constitutional amendment to allow the legislature to extend the property tax reduction enacted in 2005 to elderly and disabled people who had previously had their property taxes frozen at a higher level.
